DIGITAL CITIZENSHIP CORNER

Online games, on websites or apps, are very popular among kids of all ages. The interactive components of online games make them very appealing. While it is easy for parents to believe their children are safe while playing an online game, precautions need to be taken as most online games have a chat component where children can interact with other players on an ongoing basis.

To keep your child(ren) safer:

- -assist with the creation of online profiles, provide a parent email rather than your child's email address
- -monitor the game apps your child is downloading onto your Wi-Fi capable devices (the majority are free and can be downloaded without parent consent)
- -explore the online games your child likes to play to determine if they are age-appropriate (Is the game moderated? Does it contain sexually explicit or violent material?)
- -when setting up a video game console for the first time, be sure you are present to activate any parental controls and create passwords for those controls.
- -learn about the features of a game that allow users to restrict/block certain players' access

Vocabulary Development: Parents as Partners Make Words Concrete

When you are teaching your child new words, it is important to help students visualize them. For nouns, show your child a picture of it by searching it online, or showing a picture in a book or magazine. If it is an adjective, find things that can be described using the word. For example, if you come across the word "scratchy" point out the scratchiness of sand paper. With verbs, try acting out the words with your child. Children love moving around and would enjoy showing you what "prance" and "prowl" would look like. Have fun as you learn new vocabulary words together.
