Vocabulary

Vocabulary Development

"Vocabulary refers to the words we must understand to communicate effectively. Educators often consider four types of vocabulary: listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Listening vocabulary refers to the words we need to know to understand what we hear. Speaking vocabulary consists of the words we use when we speak. Reading vocabulary refers to the words we need to know to understand what we read. Writing vocabulary consists of the words we use in writing. Vocabulary plays a fundamental role in the reading process, and contributes greatly to a reader's comprehension. A reader cannot understand a text without knowing what most of the words mean. Students learn the meanings of most words indirectly, through everyday experiences with oral and written language. Other words are learned through carefully designed instruction". (Reading Rockets)

Try this activity at home with your child(ren) to help build vocabulary:

Vocabulary Song Lyrics

This fun, creative exercise has children write expanded definitions of rich vocabulary words in the form of a song. They can rewrite existing song lyrics or create their own. Here's an example of "Row, Row, Row Your Boat" rewritten with the word *classify*:
